

Changes coming to the OCDC!

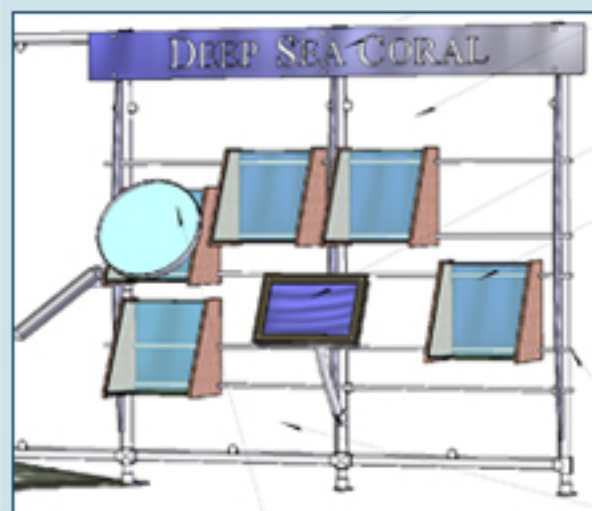

Part of the incredible research completed this summer included attaching a small video camera to the back of a blue, humpback or gray whale, and letting the animals show us what happens underwater. This amazing video footage will be part of a National Geographic special about whales airing in early 2009.
