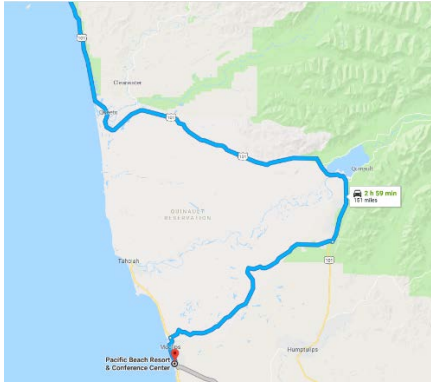

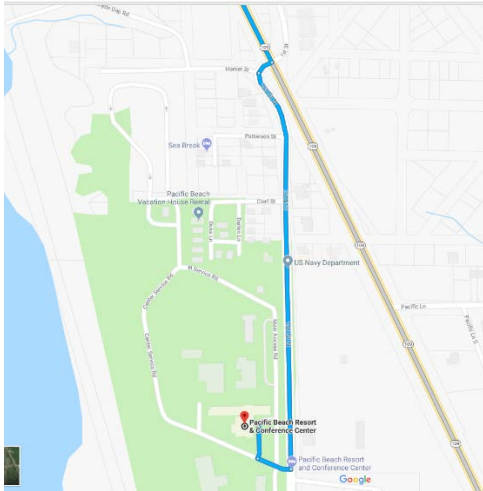

Hwy 101 to Moclips Hwy (right turn, 20.4 mi) It's a very small sign- also watch for the fisheries sign



Hwy 109 (left turn, 2.3 mi); Homer St (right turn, 72 ft); and 1<sup>st</sup> St/31412 (left turn 0.3 mi)



Service Center road (right turn), then Main Access Rd (right turn), 1<sup>st</sup> left turn into parking lot. Enter through south door. It's the first room on the left
